On Tuesday we had the pleasure of hosting Year 10 students and their parents or carers at our Post 16 Progression Evening. Those who attended found out about the Post 16 Progression journey - which starts now! Mr Taylor also covered the next 10 months and what to expect. The group then split into two sessions hosted by our MLP experts.

Ben Hillier, Head of College at S6C, spoke about A Levels. This covered why you might choose them, where you are able to study them and what subjects you might be able to study. Ben also discussed the entry requirements and what a typical day at a further education college might look like.

The second session was hosted by Amanda Sluman, MLP Careers Advisor. Amanda took everyone through the vocational routes that are available including T Levels and Apprenticeships. Amanda explained that all Level 3 study is equal, so it is about choosing the right type of course for each individual student.

There, Sol gave students a tour of the warehouse and showed them the packaging machinery. Students found out that there are many soft skills that are important to have as employees, including reliability, adaptability, good time keeping and to work well as part of a team.



Our third trip was to Magna Mazda, where James and Barney spoke to the group about the huge potential for work that there is in the automotive industry. From Sales to Logistics, Mechanics to Valeting, so many roles to choose from if you have a passion for cars. We also had a tour of their beautiful showroom and backstage areas.

He spoke about the great qualities that he looks for in his team, such as always giving every job a go – you may start at the bottom, but showing willingness and independence will help you to rise through the ranks.



Our last visit of the 'Students in Business' tour ended at Downton Tyres. Anton showed students the workshop where a car was currently having four new tyres fitted. We also saw the tyre stockroom where Anton has to store as many tyres as he can to fulfil the needs of his customer's cars on a daily basis. Students also found out the route into becoming a car mechanic, including apprenticeships, as Anton does employ apprentices and supports their training.



A huge thank you to all of our employers who gave up their time to talk to our students over the last two weeks. These visits really do offer an invaluable experience of workplaces that are on the doorstep and open their eyes to the possibilities of the different jobs, education and employment routes and the qualities that all of these employers look for in their team members.
